Organization Statement

The Seneca Nation of Indians has a diverse job market which includes employment opportunities at all three casinos Seneca Allegany, Seneca Niagara and Seneca Buffalo Creek, including opportunities within the Nation as well; positions range from maintenance and custodial to management and executive positions, as well as a number of positions that exist at Seneca Enterprises. Job Description

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Incumbent will design, coordinate and implement the health and disabilities components, as well as behavioral health. Incumbent is responsible for the recruitment, enrollment and arranging for delivery of services for children with special needs including: impairments due to physical and mental disability, stress, behavioral problems, depression, communication difficulties, dysfunctional daily living skills, and anxiety. Duties will cover all Preschool and Head Start children.

Five (5) years' experience in Early Childhood Special Education services and/or inclusion settings. Skills in communication, group process, training and development, management and record keeping. Must relate to problems of low-income families and minorities.
